

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

Royal Winchester Golf Club is committed to the care and protection of the juniors in the club. It ensures a safe, secure and friendly environment in which young golfers can develop their skills and confidence under the guidance and help of the club officers, professionals and membership.

The officers of the club, employees and membership (including juniors) all have a role in the protection of the juniors in the club, from physical attack, intimidation, bullying and abuse.

A responsible member of the club or staff is available to juniors either directly or indirectly at all times.

Any report of intimidation, bullying or abuse whether on club premises or elsewhere will be investigated thoroughly. Careful consideration of any complaint or report will be made, however trivial and seemingly insignificant. All complaints will be treated in strict confidence.

As a junior, you must be encouraged to talk and discuss minor irritants, which may have upset you, or caused unhappiness.

Club Officers and members actively encourage all juniors to learn to develop sensitivity and respect towards each other. All juniors are expected to treat others, as they would expect to be treated themselves

Parents have a duty to ensure that that their children abide by the code of conduct and the rules of the Club, at all times.

Parents also remain responsible for their children when they play casual golf or socialise in the Clubhouse.
